


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Abnormal Psychology In A Changing World (9th Edition)

Jeffrey S. Nevid is Professor of Psychology at St. John's University in New York, where he directs the Doctoral Program in Clinical Psychology, teaches at the undergraduate and graduate levels, and supervises doctoral students in clinical practicum work. He received his Ph.D. in Clinical

Psychology from the State University of New York at Albany and was a staff psychologist at Samaritan Hospital in Troy, New York. He later completed a National Institute of Mental Health Post-Doctoral Fellowship in Mental Health Evaluation Research at Northwestern University. He holds a Diplomate in Clinical Psychology from the American Board of Professional Psychology, is a Fellow of the American Psychological Association and the Academy of Clinical Psychology, and has served on the editorial boards of several psychology journals and as Associate Editor of the Journal of Consulting and Clinical Psychology. Pretty good text book with good information on mental disorders. It uses a lot of information from the DSM-V, but also adds in more significant information from studies and research that is not found in the DSM-V.

Excellent undergraduate primer with clear descriptions of the DSM-5 categories.
