

We are in the beginning stages of planning a trip to Europe. What better tool to use than this planning map. It gives you an idea of distances and major routes between cities to better plan. This

map is exactly as billed. For those complaints about this map not being very useful when you get there are obviously not paying attention. It clearly says Planning Map on the cover. It is not intended to be a detailed map you can pick up for free once you get there.

Probably the best map of Europe that I have found. We bought an atlas, but it is so detailed that it is hard to find what I am looking for. This is not so large nor bulky. The only thing I would have liked with this is the ability to "write" on it and then wipe it clean as plans change - marking routes, etc. It seems sturdy and handy to use. It doesn't appear that it will rip easily like a paper one.

I purchased this as a gift for someone backpacking Europe and was pleasantly surprised with the quality. I love the texture and it's very durable. Will hold up to getting wet and seems to fold and unfold pretty easily. Only issue was we pulled the UPC sticker off and it left a sticky residue. Cleaning it off wasn't worth the hassle, so if it won't bother you, just leave the sticker on.

on our recent trip thru Serbia, Croatia and Bosnia-Herz. Our Garmin GPS was a black hole, presenting road and street maps that stood at complete odds to what we were seeing on the ground. Or no maps at all. We plotted our trips between cities (Belgrade, Sarajevo, Dubrovnik, Split, Zagreb and back) entirely with this map, filling the gaps with the GPS where it was able. A good investment and essential trip insurance. Not sure about its durability tho; fold it carefully, the paper is rather thin.

Wonderful map--great reference; printed on quality paper. This should DEFINITELY go in your luggage and in your pocket while you are travelling.

Great map, very durable paper like material. Love it! Have not travelled with it yet, but won't leave with it!

This is a "planning map". It might help you know if your GPS is taking you to Slovenia instead of Spain, but it won't help you navigate to just about anywhere. It is a "big picture" map, I mean really BIG. If you're just looking for the overall layout of things, then it's probably okay. Don't expect to navigate with it.

Too bulky, nearly impossible to re-fold.

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
