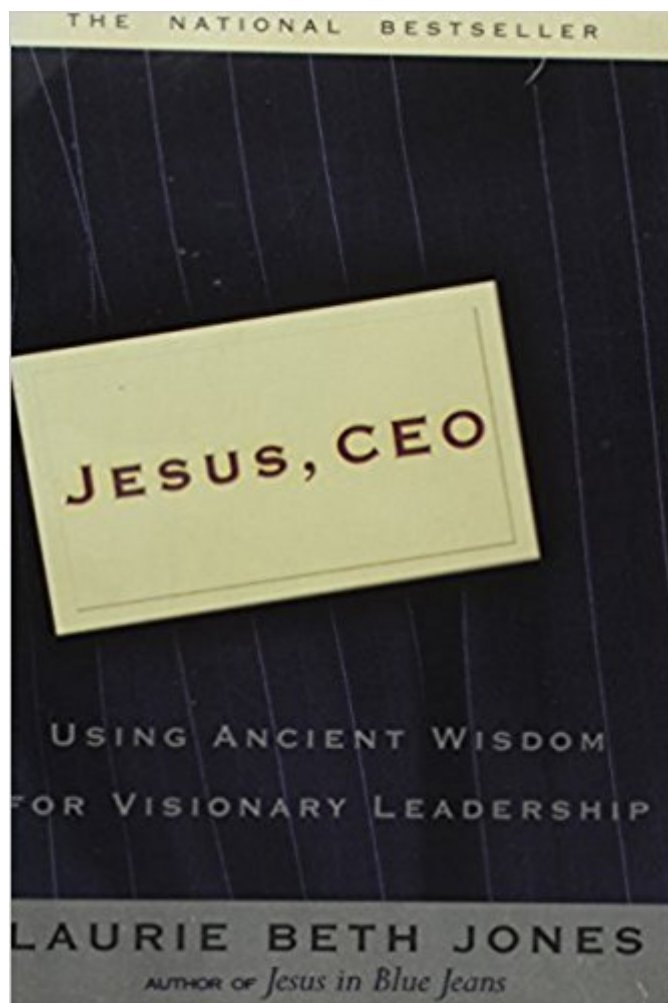

I'm not a very religious person, and I only purchased this book because it was required reading for a leadership fellowship I am participating in. Don't let the title fool you. The author is not preaching to you, she is simply stating what made Jesus a good leader. A very practical, and short chapters.

Not quite finished reading it yet, but Jones is clearly a prayerful leader who encourages others to lead thus. An inspiring read and one I will read again and again! I took the time to complete the "Questions" (reflection) at the end of each section (so far), something I admittedly don't always do. They're well-written and don't feel forced or tired. She has a very natural style in her writing and her

questioning. SOO grateful someone suggested this book to me. TRY IT! Can never be a bad thing to work your business (or do anything for that matter) like Jesus!!

I was assigned this book to read as an assignment for a leadership fellowship. Now I'm not a person who is big on religion, so I was not looking forward to reading this book. Imagine me pleasantly surprised when I read the book and enjoyed the read. The book doesn't beat you over the head with religious dogma. It simply looks at how you can be a better leader by looking at how Jesus Christ was as a leader. It's more of a development devotional. Easy to read and understand. I'm a college professor and I am now giving copies of the book to some of my students who I think will benefit from the lessons.

This is one of the best Christian business books I have ever read. It's short, sweet, and to the point with power-packed truth. It's not so much of a "how to" do business book. It's more of a "why" or "what is my values" as a Christian entrepreneur and business leader. I used it as a daily devotional! The best part are the thought provoking questions at the end of each chapter. Those questions really hit home. I actually went through the book once, and then again, and then a third time taking notes and answering the questions for myself. And then I am going to go through it again with people I work with to help them out.

I read LBJ's first edition of this book when it was initially introduced -- I really don't know where to start. This book is in a class by itself. When the book was introduced, I was working in corporate America--the everyday rat race and moving fast. I was also an ordained Church Minister. Once I saw and read some of the content, I immediately began purchasing copies for ministerial and corporate colleagues. Laurie Beth's insight, her articulation of this insight and the relevance of the material is awe inspiring. Additionally, laying it out as sort of "vitamins for the day" was brilliant. I gave back-pack copies to my children to keep with them during their college days. More than 10-years later, I still read this book once or twice yearly; I use it in leadership and ministerial training; and now I will be using it as one of our texts in Young Mens Mentoring venue and with a youth group. I recently ordered a copy for a friend who is rebounding from some devastating blows in life. ...as one individual stated in a movie many years ago, "I tell you it's that good." Stay positive and focused.
