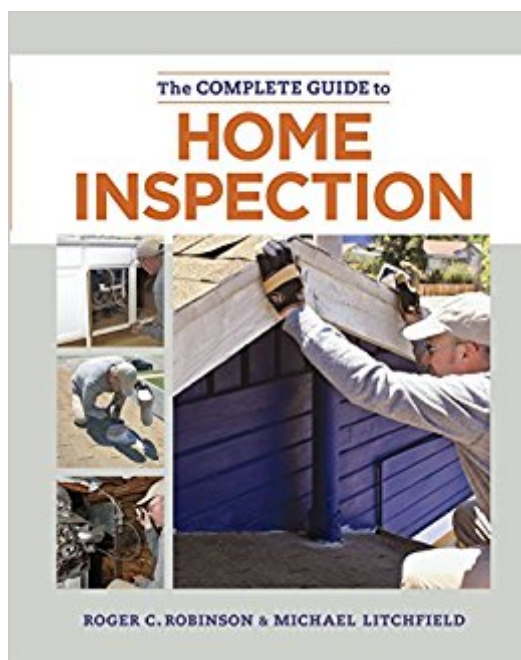

I did find it somewhat amusing that in the electrical area, while they repeatedly advise the reader that only licensed electricians should remove the panel cover, they often seem to advise on what to look for behind the cover. Guess one should take a pro with! Nevertheless, interesting, to say the least.

Incredible thorough and detailed. After buying several houses in the past four years, I now realize what an inadequate job all of the inspectors did. If you plan to buy a house, this book could save you a fortune.

Great resource if you are going to either buy or sell a house. Find all those little surprises you've not given even the smallest thought, and fix them before its way too late. Better you should know about it.
