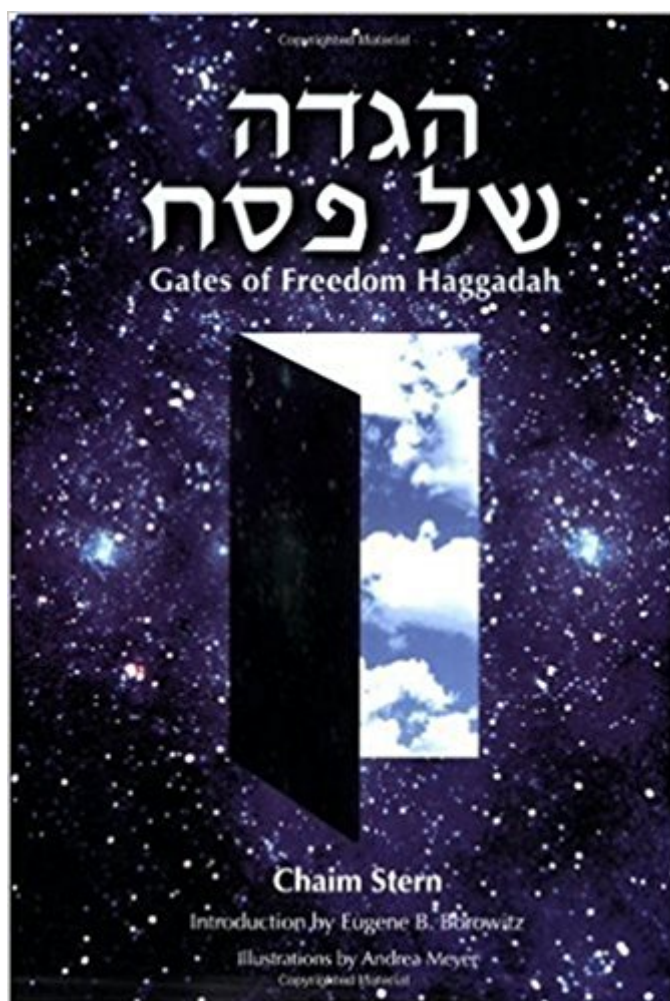

This is helpful in understanding the actions, significance of the passover meal, but falls short of

helping a non Jew to give it much of a spiritual, more universal meaning. Detailed enough to help someone perform or follow the ritual, but a little too much detail to allow for discovering a deeper understanding. i did not mean to rate it with 5 stars - 3-4 would be more appropriate - but I can't figure out how to change that.
