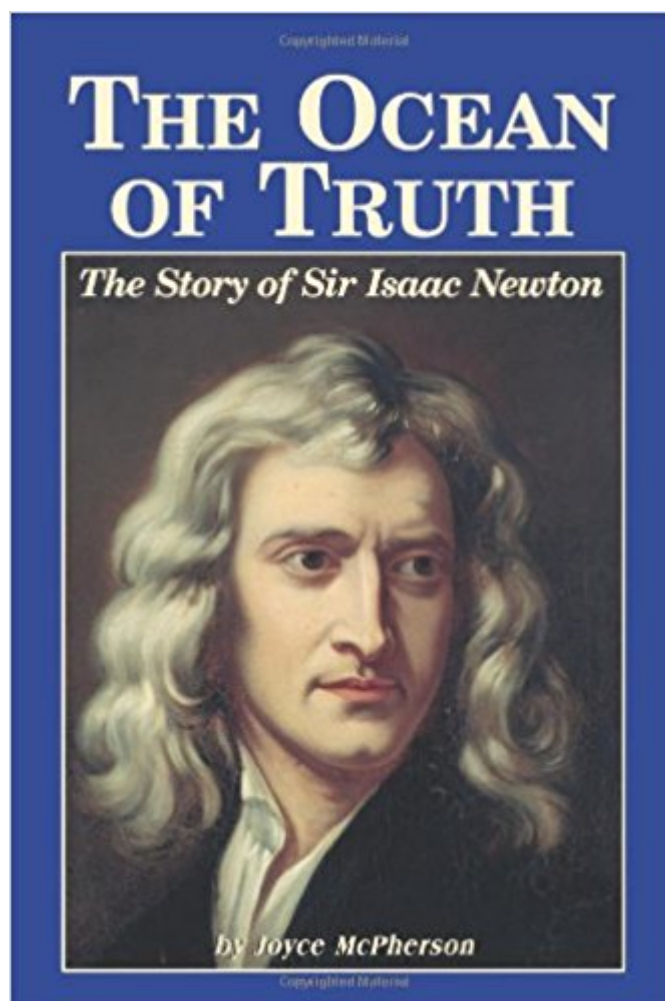

This is a great book for homeschooling! I must disagreed with the religious criticism by one reviewer. This book is written in a narrative format more similar to historical fiction except that there is no fiction in it. Being from Newton's eyes as a puritan, these religious views would be accurate for him. There is no hiding the strong war of religious ideas in that time period. No one gets a complete view of a historical time period from reading a 136 page biography. It does give a great view into Isaac Newton as a person, his accomplishments, and his views of his faith. Because of it's narrative format (not a dry reference book), it would be easier for a younger child to remember the information than that listed. I would recommend this book to any homeschooler!

I bought this book and began reading it to my children in our homeschool. After the first couple chapters, I became aware of the intense anti-catholic bias. Oliver Cromwell was held up as a spiritual leader for ordering a fast because the Catholics were persecuting some Protestant sect or other. Really? Oliver Cromwell, known to history as the "Butcher of the Irish?" Then I read that Charles the II was against the Christian Faith? Really? Oh, I see now that the author means Christian Faith = Protestant Faith. Did the author ever read of Charles the II's tolerance of William

Penn? Probably not. The point of this book seems to me (I finished it, but not out loud to my children) is to promote Protestant misconceptions of Catholicism. By holding Oliver Cromwell up as a defender of the persecuted and by touting "Christian Faith = Protestants" the author promotes misconceptions of Protestantism as well. Read this book if you are content to pass along historical inaccuracy and traditional anti-catholic rhetoric in your home.
