

I don't usually read epic fantasy, but I've always loved Russian folktales and I immensely enjoyed this novel! I cannot wait for the next book! The religious parallels are so expertly woven into young Voran's (and the 3 other main characters') experiences and I even felt a similar reflection on the current state of politics. If you're a fan of old Slavic folktales or epic fantasy, I urge you to read this!

The characters and plot are all good and-well presented, but what I really love about this book is the mythology/cosmology that brings it alive. Thin places, spiritual harmonies, meaningful covenants, awesome (and awful... and even absurd!) creatures, the ontological consequences of sin and holiness, forgiveness and revenge; it's all there and so thoroughly integrated into the plot that you can really feel it. I'm an Orthodox Christian priest and seminary professor who preaches and teaches the real-life versions of these things and I recommend this book without reservation.

My immediate reaction to this book was to respond with such adjectives as "beautiful," "breathtaking," "brilliant." Indeed, "The Song of the Sirin" is a high fantasy in the grand tradition of "The Lord of the Rings. Like this celebrated book, it is a work of exalted seriousness and sublimity. And the sublime, we know, is both beautiful and terrible. The personae of the story are enmeshed in a conflict between good and evil, between a high moral good and beauty and a malignant and seductive evil. The good characters stumble and fall--and are sometimes exasperating in their weaknesses, but their striving towards the good prevails. Some readers will recognize the influence of Russian fairy tales and folklore, as well as the lore and liturgy of the Eastern Orthodox Church, but those who do not will find the book a compelling narrative and a work of haunting beauty. Apropos of this, I recall C.S. Lewis describing his boyhood reading of the Norse myths, and his subsequent fascination of the ethereal beauty of "Northernness." Well, here is another sort of "Northernness." The kingdom of Vasyllia is a landscape of forests, mountains, waterfalls and snow, of regions above the world, and the frightening aspect of a sky filled with ravens. A journey to Vasyllia is well worth it.

Can't wait to read Nicholas Kotar's next book in the series. The Song of the Sirin: Raven Son is a great read. I read it in less than 24 hours because I couldn't put it down except when reality

called--that says it all! Though new to the Russian fairy tale genre, it was easy to acclimate. The storyline flows seamlessly from one character to another in the different dimensions. The first chapters set the scene. You'll be glued to the book so to speak. Enjoy!
