

His best friend, Gus, doesn't understand what is going on with Jack either. Jack just hasn't been the same since his older brother was killed in an accident. He doesn't stray far from the game though. Instead he finds himself working with star softball player Cassie Bennett and extends his friendship to a boy named Teddy who is picked on for his weight. His time with these two kids eventually leads Jack back to playing baseball but also helps him understand the value of friendship and helping others. Though conversations are stiff at times, Keith Nobbs's ability to express characters' feelings will make listeners care about the characters. Steeped in details about baseball, this is more for the true fan who doesn't mind play-by-play action.
