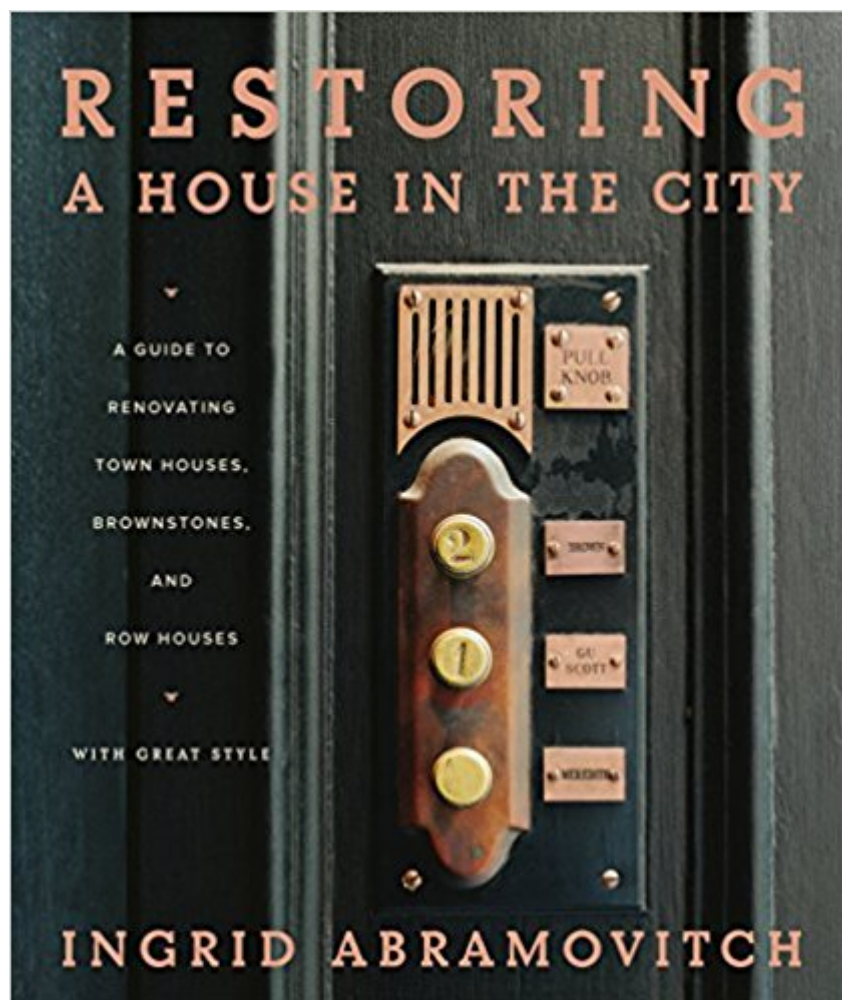

This is an outstanding book, beautifully written and well-researched, with exquisite, visually exciting photographs. The author tells a fascinating story about each of the houses and its present owners and seamlessly embeds essential facts about the house's history and its transformation. She also offers extremely useful restoration information for brownstone owners or anyone aspiring to purchase a house in the city. I shared this book with friends and they all fell in love with it, as I did.

We are considering a move to the Capitol Hill area of Washington D.C., where most houses are built in 1900 or earlier and would require some renovation. This was pretty much the ONLY book that I could find that gave examples of this type of renovation. I was very impressed with the wide array of houses, and the information in the back that talks about the potential problems for renovating

these homes. I could see this book being very useful (along with other restoration books) when and if we actually make the move.

Being about to engage on a renovation project, I thought Ingrid Abramovich's book would be useful. It was. The tips sections, by category, the index of resources are good tools. The photography is splendid and the taste in houses as well. This is an excellent book. I wish the costs of the projects had been part of the information provided, and that the properties had included a few more buildings renovated by owners for whom money was not really a concern. Still, I recommend the book to anyone interested in the topic.
