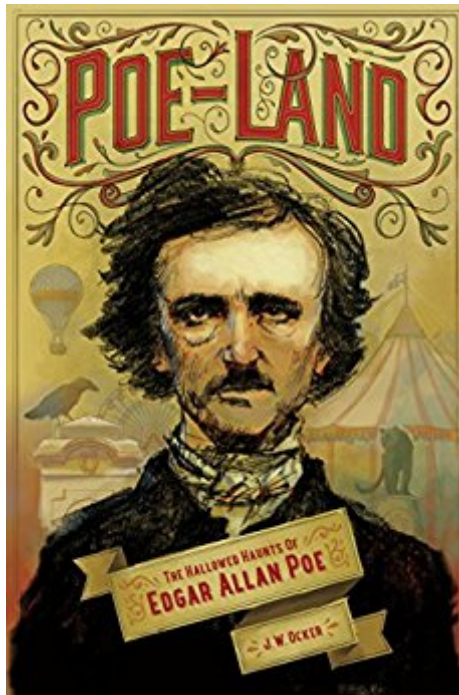




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Poe-Land: The Hallowed Haunts Of Edgar Allan Poe

What haunts, places, and even people inspired and lead him to the unique works we now know? It's a sort of equivalent to looking through the underwear drawer of someone powerful and famous, an insight into a person you didn't think you'd ever get a glimpse of. I couldn't put this book down!

A wonderful book that blends the facts of Poe's strange and difficult life, along with the author's excellent and, dare I say it, exciting journey to those places that will forever be intertwined with Poe. This book is in no way your ordinary biography of Poe, but it's every bit as good as any of the other bios out there, and it stands alone in its uniqueness; a uniqueness based on the author's narration. Upbeat, excellent, and with just the right amount of humor. It's also a book that will stay with you long after you turn that last page. And as such, it's a great addition to the Poe Collection.

Having been born and raised in Baltimore, I always had a soft spot for Poe. I have read many biographies of Poe and most recently Kenneth Silverman's fine biography, but this is such a treat! Ocker takes what could have been a scattershot approach to Poe's haunts and with a wry wink treats us to a fascinating expose on an American journey through all (or most) things Poe. I couldn't put it down. What a treat!
