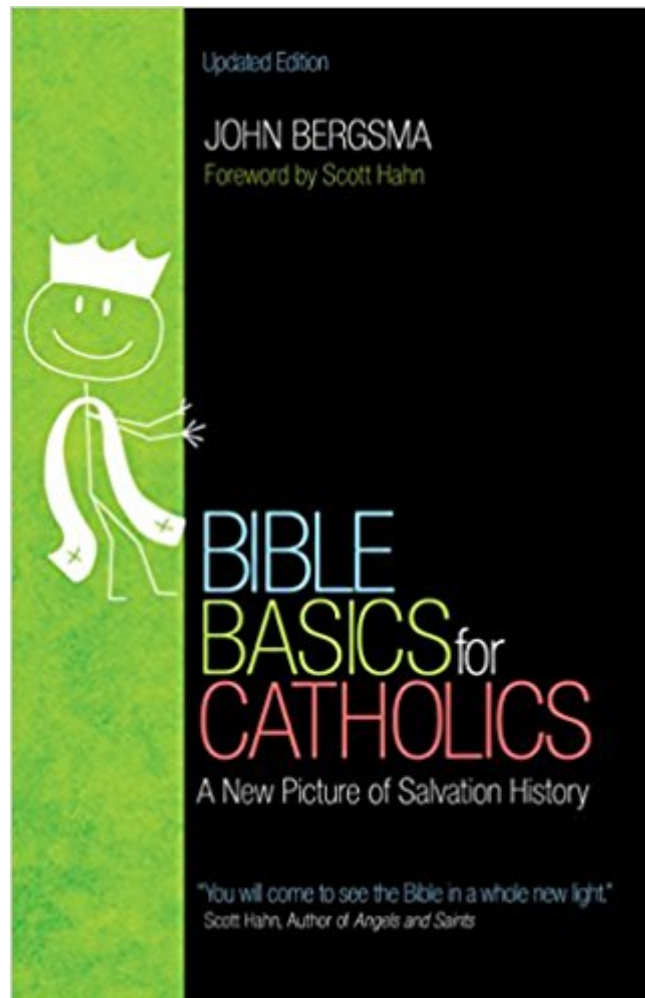




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# Bible Basics For Catholics: A New Picture Of Salvation History

John Bergsma is professor of Theology at the Franciscan University of Steubenville and a senior fellow at the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology. Twice voted Faculty of the Year by graduating classes at Franciscan University, he is a popular teacher whose love of scripture inspires his students. Bergsma earned Master of Divinity and Master of Theology degrees and served as a Protestant pastor for four years before converting to Catholicism in 2001 while working on his doctorate in theology at the University of Notre Dame. He specialized in Old Testament and the Dead Sea Scrolls, graduating with high honors in 2004. His articles, some coauthored with Scott Hahn, have appeared in the Journal of Biblical Literature and other academic and popular periodicals. A frequent speaker at conferences and parishes, Dr. Bergsma has appeared as a guest on Franciscan University Presents, EWTN's The Journey Home, and Relevant Radio's Drew Mariani Show. He and his wife, Dawn, live with their eight children in Steubenville, Ohio.

If you have ever felt baffled by the Old Testament and wondered how it relates to the New Testament, this is the book for you. I've been a serious student of the Bible (at a layman's level) for nearly a decade, and I couldn't see the forest for the trees. After reading this book, the big picture of salvation history finally began to reveal itself to me. The author is a convert to the Catholic faith from Protestantism. He is a professor of theology and has received honors for his outstanding teaching ability. Bergsma has taken college-level concepts and packaged them in an entertaining and easy-to-read format with stick-figure drawings to illustrate his points. He bases his text around the Old Testament covenants God made with Adam, Noah, Abraham, Moses and David, all leading to fulfillment in the Eucharistic covenant of Jesus Christ. Through his discussion of these covenants, Bergsma covers the history of God's interaction with his people throughout the books of the Old Testament in a clear and compelling overview. At only 180 pages, the book is a short read, but it is

crammed with information. It is appropriate for teen-agers and adults. It is an excellent supplement to more detailed books on the Bible that you may be reading. Highly recommended.

This book taught me how to look at the entire bible as one big story from Genesis to Jesus; it shows how everything is connected and related through the many covenants. I feel as though I can, now, gain a better understanding of what I am reading when I read the events within any part of the bible by looking at it through the understanding of salvation history. This book is written in very simple and easy to read language which includes picture diagrams of the sequence within the time line; and I feel that even a child will be able to understand its simple explanation. This book ended my confusion.

Our parish priest recommended this book at a parents meeting for First Communion prep. It was an easy read that broke down the multiple covenants found within the Bible, comparing the similarities of each and explaining how each was built from the previous one ending with the ultimate New Covenant in Jesus Christ. I had been looking for something that would tie everything together and found it. Even as a lifelong Catholic, Mass makes more sense after reading and is much more powerful. Highly recommend for anyone looking for a good summary of the Bible, whether Catholic or not.
