

The reader walks the land with Jesus through the Gospels, as he devours the commentaries. It may be the next best thing to actually going to the Holy Land, which my wife and I did 42 years ago. The Gospels are definitely a ministry "journey with Jesus". Courson has the ability to transport one into Christ's life and times. Jon Courson's three Application Commentaries are becoming my Bible of choice to read and study. It is too bad they are not in a leather bound edition. His commentary in the Pauline Epistles simplifies the reader's understanding, especially in the lengthy multi-subject sentences of Paul's deep doctrinal writing style. The other writers are justly handled as well. I highly recommend getting all three volumes.

My friend had one of these hardback and I decided that I'd like it on kindle because then I could write notes and highlight in it--PLUS it's a little cheaper and not as heavy (it's a big, bulky book). But unfortunately, my Kindle battery died. I ordered a new one and they said they don't make batteries for my model anymore!! Shock. Well, I downloaded the Kindle PC version and now I can still access my books on my pc. I know this is off the subject of the commentary. Sorry. You need to know that it's an Application Commentary; how to apply scripture to your life--not so much a hermanutical or histological study of the scriptures. Great insights and lots of his stories. Love it, although Pastor Jon is much better to listen to in person!

I not only have a hard copy of Courson's commentary but bought it for my Kindle so I could always

have it at hand. Some Commentaries are drawn out and hard to understand. Jon wrote easy to understand comments so anyone could say "I got it." I have 2 other commentaries and get bogged down with all the big words and long explanations. Jon's commentary is for people who do not have a PHD in Divinity. I can hardly wait for his OT to be available for my Kindle. Why did I buy Courson's Commentary? I have listened to his sermons on radio for years and enjoyed his teachings. I had faith that his commentary would be good.

I enjoy Jon's style of writing. I sat under his teaching both at church and the radio ministry, and he always keeps you focused on Jesus. He uses numerous examples, both from text and personal experiences, to help clarify and understand certain passages. He articulates well and expresses a solid command of the English language. He knows the Word and sheds much light throughout the book. I do use it as my daily devotional, and have for many years, as well as a study resource for class. I would definitely recommend this commentary and have, for daily reading, or for an additional study resource.
