

He is a lifelong writer, having learned at the typewriter of his mother, Virginia, who was a correspondent for the St. Paul Pioneer Press in the 1950s. Before joining the family riverboat business, he was a newspaper editor and corporate public relations executive. Captain Kosmo founded the Minnesota Valley Branch YMCA, served as chair of the Rivers Region of the national Passenger Vessel Association, served on the Bayport (MN) Planning Commission, and was elected a Bayport City Council member and mayor.
