

THE AWEN ALONE was a really thoughtful little book about solitary druidism. I really enjoyed it. Perhaps what struck me most (besides the author's careful and elegant tone) was that she is committed not only to helping the environment, but other people. She encourages a conscientious lifestyle that I so rarely see in Pagan books these days (which are self-indulgent to the point of narcissism anymore). As an introduction piece, there is the expected chapters on both ritual and holy days that are part of every pagan book, but THE AWEN ALONE provides enough original, thoughtful material that the experienced pagan shouldn't mind. This was a great introduction to druidism, and it made me curious to explore the faith further. This was a truly successful entry into the Pagan Portal series, and I hope to read more from Joanna van der Hoeven in the future.

I'm sorry to give a negative review, but I had to struggle to finish this book, it started boring me and ended making me angry, it's also quite limited and doesn't actually say nothing about solitary druidry that I couldn't have gotten from any other druidry book. There is nothing here about solitary druidry, it's more a book about introduction to druidism and not a good one, you can find wonderful books about it here on this site easily. This writing is limited, suited for people in specific life situations like living in a weather similar to the UK, healthy people, preferably in less urban areas. The judgmental tone in some parts of the book really annoyed me, mentions about how we create drama in our lives, also something that reminds me of a limited buddhist worldview, being

attached to our thoughts and emotions is bad, living in the present is necessary (unlike what simple books say you should be careful with mindfulness), reality is not so bad so don't live in your head. It also focuses on blood ancestors too much and the way it deals with abuse made me angry, releasing blame is not my way. If the book gave me any ideas about solitary druidism I would have tried to give a better review but it said nothing that general books didn't tell me better.
